

## NAVY CYP PHILOSOPHY

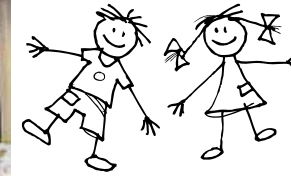

## CHILD ELIGIBILITY

Dependent children of military personnel, Department of Defense (DoD) Civilian personnel, reservists on active duty or inactive duty for training and Department of Defense Contractors of Naval Station Newport are eligible. All eligible children must be registered on [www.militarychildcare.com](http://www.militarychildcare.com) and are placed according to priority until space is available within the facility.

**JOHN F. KENNEDY CHILD DEVELOPMENT  
CENTER (CDC) (401) 841-4562**

The Naval Station Newport CDC provides full-day care in a developmentally-appropriate learning environment for children ages six weeks through five years old. The center is open Monday through Friday, 6:45 am - 5:30 pm and is closed on all federal holidays and weekends.

## SCHOOL AGE CARE (SAC) (401) 841-2883

School Age Care Program offers before and after school care for ages five through 12 years old. During the summer, the SAC Program offers summer camp which runs from June through August for children ages five through 12 years old. The SAC Program is located on the first floor of Building 1297, adjacent to the CDC. SAC is open Monday through Friday, 6:45 am - 5:30 pm and is closed on all federal holidays and weekends.
